Dr. Ricky Jones of University of Louisville Pan-African Studies says, "If I could only suggest ONE book on oppressive systems and potential ways to reform them, this would be it! Freire's work is actually rooted in Brazil but it applies to what we are seeing in the United States and many other spaces. It is a classic, eye-opening piece."
