**ADVOCATE:** The lack of affordable housing continues to be the greatest crisis facing the Black community in this country. One troubling issue is that when new affordable units are built, they're often located in lower income zip codes. This practice tends to **concentrate poverty**, leaving little opportunity for those residents, thus preserving or exacerbating the effects of poverty. Speak out against this practice. New developments must be okayed by your Metro Council (city council or aldermen). Let your councilmember know that concentrating poverty in this way is unacceptable. Write a letter, urging them to support affordable housing in every ZIP Code.
